

# ...Educating, Preserving, and Promoting Chinese & Chinese-American history and culture in Santa Clara Valley

#### Chinese American Historical Museum (CAHM) in the 1888 replica Ng Shing Gung building

The original Ng Shing Gung was constructed in 1888, in Heinlenville, the last of five San Jose Chinatowns. Heinlenville was named after John

Heinlen, a German immigrant, who even against public opinion helped the Chinese after the Market Street Chinatown arson fire in 1887.

Ng Shing Gung stood on the corner of Taylor and Sixth Streets. The building served the Chinese community as a meeting hall, Chinese school, hostel, and a place of worship. Today, the building is a historical museum in History Park San Jose, showcasing the Chinese and Chinese American pioneers of the Santa Clara Valley.

The stories & artifacts of the previous Chinatowns are in separate free-standing exhibit cases. The pictorial tri-level Timeline begins at 1850 and continues with the digital timeline extension. The second floor displays the original temple altar in all its restored splendor. The altar pieces show off the elaborate hand-carved gilded teak woodwork that was manufactured in Canton City, China in 1892.

In 1987, Chinese Historical and Cultural Project (CHCP), a non-profit organization, was formed to reconstruct the Ng Shing Gung, as a Chinese historical museum in the San Jose History Park. The museum was dedicated on September 29, 1991, and gifted to the San Jose Community. Today, the museum is called the Chinese American Historical Museum in the 1888 replica Ng Shing Gung building.
